

How Flames Basketball Club Works



Each team will be independent, taking responsibility in organizing, player selecting, getting games, etc. yet still work within the Flames guidelines.

Each team/coach will be responsible for:

1. Assembling their team by either hand selecting or having tryouts.
3. Selecting your season's game format and schedule (see game information)
4. Organize your team's practice sessions and schedule (see "Practice Outline").
5. Ordering team T-shirts or sweatshirts if desired.
6. Organize your fundraiser events (getting sponsors, selling candy, dinners, etc.) and keeping proper records of money collected.
7. Following the Club team rules.
8. Represent our Farwell community well with your attitude, organization and commitment.
9. Always be honest and respectable with tournament leaders, referees and opponents.
10. Turn in your team roster and game schedule to the "Girls Basketball" mailbox in the Farwell high school office.
11. Distribute uniforms and make sure they all get returned (in same condition) along with anything else given to you from Flames.

While each team is independently ran we feel it is good for all coaches to be accountable to a higher group for direction and help at times. Dee Yarger and Bruce Owens will act as overseers in getting the ball rolling and establishing the following functions.

Flames function will include:

1. Have a kick off coaches meeting and pass out Club information packet to give guidance to getting teams going.
2. Organize and run a tryout session for filling rosters. Coaches are involved in selecting their teams based on tryout results on this date.
3. Have a big spaghetti dinner or other fund raiser event with money to be distributed equally among teams. Athletes to sell tickets.
4. Work with school AD in getting gym time for practices and then working with each team to get a practice time that best fits their team.
5. Assist teams and coaches with suggestions and guidance throughout the season.
6. Distribute Flames uniforms, balls, bags and practice pinnies.
7. Flames is NOT responsible or liable for decisions made by coaches, players or fans.

Things the coach needs to tell parents:

1. Team rules
2. When practices will be
3. When games will be
4. How much will it cost to play
5. Once you have a team selected, have a parents meeting and discuss/pass out:
 - A. Club information and rules
 - B. Games/practice schedules
 - C. Maps to gyms you'll be playing at
 - D. Your coaching philosophy
 - E. Questions and answer time
 - F. Proper care of uniforms
